The Tenements and Grounds in the said West Lordship, and Part of the East Lordship have formerly been used in Common among the said Lords and Owners who have observed divers In-conveniences thereby agreed to divide the same. To which Purpose they with all their mutual and free Consent made Choice of William Tempest of Thornally in the County of Durham and Thomas Ingelby of Raventoft in the County of York Gentleman, with the Assistance of Thomas Cowling, who having perused the Survey and duly considered the Quantity and Quality of the Tenements and Grounds hereinafter mentioned have allotted divided and set forth unto the said Sir William Selby Sir</p>
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[Bud-86] <p>Robert Hodgson and M<sup>r</sup>. Anderson their several Quantities and Proportions thereof as hereafter in this Book more at large appeareth. You may observe herein that M<sup>r</sup>. Tempests Tenement in Thornally with <u>after</u> Tenements and Grounds are left in Common and some Grounds in Partnership as hereafter also appeareth.</p>	[0c] <p>such Grounds as are in Partnership or left in Common amongst all the Lords or Owners. The Letters <b>a</b>, <b>b</b>, <b>c</b>, set before the Name of any particular or Parcel of Ground serve to understand the Quantity of it: As such Grounds as have the Letter <b>a</b>, before them are of the best Quality, such as have the Letter <b>b</b>, of the second, such as have <b>c</b>, of the worst.</p>
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Notwithstanding the said Allotment or Division the Colliery throughout the whole Lordship with the Highways Water Courses Mines Quarries Commons Turbaries Fishings Fowlings Mills Mill Dams Waives and Strays Perquisites of Court Suit of Court and such like are left undivided to remain and be used as heretofore. At the last End of this Book is set down what Woods are divided and what left in Common.

In the next Page under M<sup>r</sup>. Anderson and so unto the ninth are set down the several Quantities of all the Tenements and Grounds allotted unto M<sup>r</sup>. Anderson upon the several Divisions as also his Part or Quantity of

Also there are several Letters in some of the Columns between the said Letters **a**, **b**, **c**, and the Names of the Grounds which serve to such particular Grounds upon the Platt as have not their Names writ in them, for the Scale being small as the Quantity thereof their Names and the Farmers Names could not be writ in them, So that all those Grounds in the Platt wherein the Letter **A** is set and shadowed with are M<sup>r</sup>. Andersons: but **a**, being joined with another Letter sheweth it to have been in the Occupation, or called by such Name as such Letters are set against in this Book. And also those with **S**, and shadowed with are Sir Will<sup>m</sup>. Selby's,
